### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Royal Oak has historically taken a reactive approach to addressing fats, oils, and grease (FOG) issues in our sewer system—particularly in the downtown and other restaurantheavy areas. To manage these challenges, we currently rely on a network of slow-release tablets throughout the system to prevent backups. While this method helps mitigate immediate risks, it does not address the source of the problem.

We are now exploring more proactive, long-term strategies to manage FOG. A key part of this effort will be asking our next Sustainability Systems Manager to develop a Downtown Waste Management Plan. This plan will help us better characterize our waste streams, provide system-wide recommendations with key performance indicators (KPIs), and ultimately offer the City and the DDA a focused, data-driven roadmap for sustainable waste management.

As part of this shift, we are proposing a new FOG management program that emphasizes education, source reduction, and consistent enforcement led by the company Eganix. The program will include:

- A comprehensive review and potential updates to our wastewater ordinance to improve compliance.
- Routine site inspections, wastewater testing, reporting, and ongoing monitoring.
- A GIS dashboard to track FOG compliance across 106 food preparation locations in the downtown and Woodward corridor.

Eganix has agreed to attend the Environmental Advisory Board (EAB) and Downtown Development Authority (DDA) meetings in July to discuss the topic with both boards.

Although this service is not currently budgeted, we anticipate the program will lead to significant savings by reducing our reliance on the slow-release tablets (currently budgeted at \$97,000 annually) and by decreasing the amount of time our crews spend on emergency inspections and cleanings each week. We will closely monitor program costs throughout the year and address any material overages through future budget amendments. Long-term, this approach is expected to create both operational and financial efficiencies for the City.

The DPS has identified offsetting reductions that can offset the costs of this program, which include reducing the tablet use in sewers at a budgeted cost of \$97,000. We hope this will cover the cost of this program.
